Heidelberg Catechism #26

Christian: What do you believe when you say in the Apostles' Creed: "I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth"?

We believe that the eternal Father of our Lord Jesus Christ—
who out of nothing created heaven and earth
and everything in them,
and who still upholds and rules them
by His eternal counsel and providence—
is my God and Father
because of Jesus Christ His Son.

I trust Him so much that I do not doubt that He will provide whatever I need for body and soul, and He will turn to my good whatever adversity He sends me in this sad world.

He is able to do this because He is Almighty God; He desires to do this because He is a faithful Father.

The Heidelberg Catechism was composed in Heidelberg, Germany in 1563. It has been translated into many European, Asian, and African languages and is the most widely used and most warmly praised catechism of the Reformation period.
